THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Father, you made the world and love your creation. You gave your Son Jesus Christ to be our Saviour. His dying and rising have set us free from sin and death. And so we gladly thank you, with saints and angels praising you, and saying:

All Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

We praise and bless you, loving Father, through Jesus Christ, our Lord; and as we obey his command, send your Holy Spirit, that broken bread and wine outpoured may be for us the body and blood of your dear Son.

On the night before he died he had supper with his friends and, taking bread, he praised you. He broke the bread, gave it to them and said: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

When supper was ended he took the cup of wine. Again he praised you, gave it to them and said: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross. Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

One of these four acclamations is used Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died:

Christ is risen:

Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth. Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the saints to feast at your table in heaven. Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever. *All* **Amen.**

## **Guidelines for Communion**

- Communion will be received by congregation as bread only.
- The bread will be consecrated at the altar (remaining covered) and will be brought to you in the pews by the priest (wearing a face mask, and maintaining distance as much as possible).
- To receive communion please indicate that you wish to by placing your hands out in front of you. If you do not wish to receive communion please keep them lowered.
- Once the priest has moved on to another person then remove your face mask and receive the bread.

## Guidelines for Worship

- Please follow hygiene and distancing advice.
- Sanitise hands on entering and leaving.
- Please wear a face covering when attending church for services.
- Singing is discouraged inside church buildings. Weather permitting the final hymn is sung outside.
- Seats have been marked. Please fill from the front to allow for physical distancing. At least one row MUST be left empty between worshippers.
- A collection will be taken during a hymn.
   Please place offerings on the plate with minimal hand contact, ideally in sealed envelopes.
- Please leave church from the back pews first.
- If you have symptoms of Covid-19 please stay at home. If you are clinically vulnerable or shielding please take extra care if attending worship.
- Our online worship continues, see our website, or contact clergy for other material for home worship.
- A register of attendees will be taken to aid NHS Track and Trace scheme including names, telephone numbers and postcodes.
   This information will be kept for 3 weeks.
